Anti-Doping Policy



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Policy Statement

The Judo Federation of Australia (South Australia) [Judo SA] condemns the use of Prohibited Substances and Methods in sport. The use of Prohibited Substances and Methods is contrary to the ethics of sport and potentially harmful to the immediate and long-term health of athletes.

The only legitimate use of Prohibited Substances and Methods is under the supervision of a physician for a clinically justified purpose in accordance with Article 7.4 of the JFA Inc. Anti Doping policy.

Doping is fundamentally contrary to the spirit of sport.

Policy Application

This policy applies to members, athletes, coaches, officials, volunteers and employees and contractors of Judo SA and its member clubs.

Judo SA aims to stop Doping practices in sport by:

- Abiding by the provisions of the South Australian Drugs in Sports policy;
- Endorsing the JFA Inc Anti Doping Policy and its provisions;
- educating and informing Persons about drugs in sport issues;
- supporting the drug testing programs and education initiatives of JFA Inc, ASDA and other Anti-Doping Organisations; and
- imposing effective sanctions on persons who commit Anti-Doping Rule violations, not covered by the JFA Inc policy.

Any competitor must disclose at registration with Judo SA any positive test result for which they have been sanctioned by any state, national, union or international sporting organization or Anti-Doping Organisation.

This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure it remains consistent with JFA Inc Anti Doping policy, and that it remains relevant and practicable.
